General overview

Coe College is a very special sort of institution, a small liberal-arts college. Most students in the US study at large universities: institutions with 30,000 or 40,000 students that grant bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. Coe has 1,400 students, all studying at the bachelor's level. Because 95% of students reside on our green, historic, urban campus, a vibrant social world arises here: tons of clubs to participate in, lectures to attend, art shows to visit, concerts to hear, athletic teams to watch or play on. We're situated centrally in a city of 130,000--much smaller than Manchester, but still with Indian and Thai restaurants, Vietnamese and Ghanaian groceries, bike paths, a shopping mall.
