

# Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship

#### **About the programme**

A Chartered Manager is someone who can take responsibility for people, projects, operations and/or services to deliver long term organisational success, with the professional recognition of their ability to deliver impact, behave ethically and demonstrate their commitment to continual learning and development.

The programme, designed in collaboration with the Chartered Management Institute (CMI), and regional and national employers, provides the knowledge and skills you will need to become a confident management professional.

#### Who is it for?

If you have aspirations of working in a management role or developing your career as a manager, then the Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship could be your next step.

#### What are the entry requirements?

You must be employed and individual employers will set the selection criteria for their Apprenticeships.

Academically, students registering to the programme will need to meet the relevant entry criteria.

#### What qualification will be achieved?

Upon successful completion of the course you will achieve the BSc (Hons) Business and Management. In addition you will receive the Level 6 Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship and will be eligible for membership of professional bodies including CMI and ILM.

#### How long is the apprenticeship?

The typical duration for this apprenticeship is four years, but will depend on the previous experience of the apprentice. You will have a maximum of five years to complete the programme.

#### What will be studied?

You will study a core curriculum that focuses on organisational performance, personal effectiveness, and project and transferable skills. Modules may include; Principles of Accounting; Principles of Human Resource Management; Business Statistics; Operations Management; Organisational Behaviour; International Business; Strategic Management and Business Ethics and Sustainability.

#### How will the apprenticeship be delivered?

You will participate in off the job training for one day per week during your studies with work based learning being supported as part of your work commitment.

A variety of teaching and learning methods with be employed, as appropriate, these include:

- Lectures
- Team work
- Student Presentations (individual and group)
- Seminars
- Tutorials
- Laboratory Style workshops
- Independent and guided learning

#### How will the apprenticeship be assessed?

Assessment is both formative and summative and is achieved by a variety of methods which are focused around the workplace.
