

Maxwell Building

- Our main reception is located at the front of Maxwell
- Maxwell is home to our Built Environment courses
- A GP Surgery is located on the third floor
- You'll also find our Language Resource Centre and one of our many SALFOOD cafeterias, where you can grab lunch at our very own Subway

Peel Building


- The Peel Building is the oldest building on campus. It was opened by King George V and Queen Mary in 1896 to house the Salford Royal Technical Institute
- Today, Peel is home to our Human and Natural sciences courses and the building hosts regular public events in its impressive concert hall

Cockcroft Building


- Here you'll find our Bodmer Laboratories, a flexible science lab space that can hold up to 144 students in its bigger configuration
- Home to KidsCan; a children's cancer research charity
- Other facilities include the world's first Energy House - a typical 1920s end terrace house (think Coronation Street) that has been reconstructed in a fully environmentally controllable chamber

Newton Building


- Newton Building is the home of our Computing and Engineering courses
- Shhh! In here you'll find the Anechoic Chamber. As one of the quietest rooms in Europe, it's perfect for testing acoustics.
- Other facilities include the Aeronautical Engineering Labs, including an Elite Flight Training System which is used by students and airline pilots to top-up their flight hours
- It is also home to a purpose-built lab for Autonomous and Automated Vehicle Technology and the introduction of 'Jouli', Salford's completely autonomous vehicle!

Lady Hale Building


- Lady Hale is the home of Salford Business School, it also houses a Santander Bank, so students have access to banking on campus
- The building is aptly named after the UK's first female law lord - and Baroness of Richmond - Brenda Hale
- Lady Hale is home to the Business School's student support team, including the School office and the Employability Hub
- It is the base for the Law and Business societies, and has a mock court where Moot debates are held and has several open study spaces

New Adelphi Building

- New Adelphi is our £55 million cultural and creative hub, housing our School of Arts and Media and Architecture facilities
- Here you'll find a 350-capacity theatre, industry standard recording studios, dance and performance studios, material workshops and more
- All of these facilities allow us and our students to strengthen the relationships we have with industry collaborators, including HOME, The Lowry, Islington Mill, ITV and the BBC

Clifford Whitworth Library


- The library has recently undergone a complete refurbishment to create 'the library in the park'
- Offering a fresh, modern learning space with PC suites, Mac computers, laptops to loan, bookable work rooms and a café all available to students
- Open 24/7, 364 days a year, only closing on Christmas Day

Chapman Building


- Chapman Building contains 6 lecture theatres all of which are 100+ capacity, plus 3 seminar rooms
- There is a SALFOOD café, bookable group study rooms and social lounge

Peel Park Quarter and Peel Park


- Peel Park Quarter is our campus accommodation, complete with secure parking, a launderette, gym, games room and cinema room
- If you're looking for an en suite room this is where you want to be as it was voted as the second best halls of residence in the UK (Student Hut, August 2019)
- Peel Park is one of the oldest public parks in the country and has recently undergone a £1.6m restoration
- Feel free to take a stroll around the flower gardens

Sports Centre

- The centre boasts a 25 metre, 5 lane, deck level swimming pool, with sauna and spa
- Other facilities include a jacuzzi, dance studio, squash courts, 5 fitness suites, and Sports Massage Clinic

University House


- Home of our student support services team, askUS
- The Students' Union is an independent organisation run by elected students to represent the student voice
- Atmosphere Bar and Café is a great place to relax with friends, offering affordable food and drink and hosting a range of events
- Unitemps offers part-time and full-time temporary work opportunities to students at the University

Allerton Building


- Allerton plays host to our Podiatry, Physiotherapy and Clinical Gait Analysis clinics. Students gain work experience in these clinics and they can also be used by staff and the public
- Psychology labs and the occupational health service are also based here
- Allerton is home to student study space the B'Hive, as well as a pop up library and its own Starbucks

Brian Blatchford Building


- Our Prosthetics and Orthotics labs are based in this building, where students gain hands-on clinical practice while dealing with patients
- In the plaster room, impressions of a patient's anatomy are made in order to manufacture custom prostheses or orthoses
- The rehab gym and sports rehab clinic are also based here

Mary Seacole Building

- Our state-of-the-art simulation suites are based in Mary Seacole Building. They replicate a real hospital environment allowing Nursing, Midwifery and Allied Health Professions students to train in a safe and controlled environment
- Occupational Therapy students learn how to adapt surroundings for their patients in the rehabilitation flat
- The imaging suite for Radiography students is also based here
