

# MSc/PgDip/PgCert APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY (THERAPIES)



### **COURSE SUMMARY**

This course will equip you with a valuable professional insight into topics including the causes of addiction and how Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) and other evidence based psychotherapies can be used to help address stress, depression, chronic pain and other related disorders.

You'll find the course particularly relevant if you are working in the NHS or healthcare independent sector, including addiction clinics, and want to develop your knowledge and understanding of psychological therapy beyond the basic level offered on some professional qualification courses.

### **COURSE CONTENT**

During your first semester of study you will undertake modules such as Research Methods in Psychology and Psychological Therapies for Common Mental Health Disorders.

The second semester will cover modules such as; Addictive Behaviour and Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) and Physical Health. The CBT module will provide a rigorous theoretical and evidence-based introduction to using CBT with clients who have physical health conditions

In the third semester, you will complete a dissertation which provides you with the opportunity to pursue an area of applied psychology and psychological therapies that directly relates to your own work or interests.

### **CAREER PROSPECTS**

This course is an excellent springboard towards becoming a leader within your profession. Using the skills learnt on the course could also open doors to more senior roles in CBT and therapeutic intervention, two areas the government currently views as key to effective modern healthcare provision.
