



eBook Central – Provides access to over 170,00 electronic textbooks on a wide range of topics. eBook central has a useful FAQ pages which offers guidance on searching, download book and reading books online see <a href="https://ebookcentral.proquest.com/lib/salford/readerSupportHelp.action">https://ebookcentral.proquest.com/lib/salford/readerSupportHelp.action</a>. Sign into eBook Central with your Salford University email address and password.

Business Source Premier (EBSCO) – Contains access to a broad range of journals encompassing trade journals and peer reviewed, titles include Harvard Business Review, Academy of Management Journal, Journal of Marketing & the Journal of Finance. In addition to journal articles, Business Source Premier also contains a library of company profiles which provide a detailed company history, a list of top competitors for peer review and often give a detailed SWOT & revenue analysis. Business Source Premier also contains useful country reports and industry profiles. Sign into Business Source Premier with your Salford email address and password.


When searching for journal articles, limit your search to where full text is available within the database to prevent redirects to inaccessible documents:








To use the library of company profiles first click on the Company Profiles link from the menu bar at the top of the screen:



#### To find country report and industry profiles:








ProQuest Central is made up of separate, fully searchable databases which may be used together or separately. The ProQuest Central collection includes full text scholarly journals, trade and professional journals, newspapers, magazines, dissertations, market, industry, and country reports from Economist Intelligence Unit, BMI, ISI Emerging Markets, and more. The subject areas include business, economics, accounting, finance, management, taxation, and law.

To search for case studies, market reports, country reports etc. click on advanced search – type in the keywords for your topic and then choose the source or document type you want to read:

Westlaw – provides access to legal materials. It contains UK legislation, case law, legal journals, current awareness, and news, EU, U.S. & international materials. The databse also contains 58 books including Chitty on Contracts, the IDS Employment Law Handbooks, Palmer's company Law and the White Book. Unpaywall – is a browser extension which links you to millions of peer reviewed journal articles – it is a legal, fast, and free way to read research papers. Use the link on the Unpaywall website here: <a href="https://unpaywall.org/products/extension">https://unpaywall.org/products/extension</a> to download the browser extension then when you search using Google Scholar or other websites when you see a green tab at the side of a research article, click on it to read the article for free:



Theses – towards the end of your programme you might have to complete a thesis or dissertation – some students like to look at examples and we have various resources you can use. Your tutor should provide you with details about the format they want you to use and the Library has guides to writing your dissertation and formatting your dissertation.

There are databases which give you access to past dissertations & theses – most institutions only digitise research awards such as PhDs – this shouldn't matter if you want to look at the layout, contents pages, bibliography etc.

#### The databases include:

Salford E-theses Collection Research theses which have been successfully submitted and passed by the University of Salford are available for download. Awards eligible for inclusion in this collection are PhD, MPhil, MSc by research, MRes, DProf, DLit, DMA, DSc. To find a thesis, use the quick search box, or the browse options in the left-hand menu. The Salford collection is relatively small so to look at a theses /dissertation on your topic you might have to search beyond the Salford collection.

<u>Ebsco Open Dissertations</u> - a free database with records for more than 1.4 million electronic theses and dissertations from more than 320 universities around the world. Search by keywords and follow the links to view the thesis in the repository of the awarding University.
