


As a student at the University of Salford, you have the chance to acquire invaluable employability skills and become a global citizen by applying for:

These offer you the fantastic opportunity to develop new skills that will impress future employers, embrace new cultures and make friends all over the world.

Why should you take advantage of any of our international opportunities on offer, while studying towards your degree?



BENEFITS

- 1. Gain a global mindset and become a global citizen: whether it's in work, study or play, you'll be able to use your new global mindset to back up arguments, inform your beliefs and steer your future
- 2. Brush up your language skills or learn a new language
- **3.** Learn self-reliance: moving abroad is the ultimate test in self-reliance. When (or if) you move back, you'll likely rely on others less and you'll take more responsibility for yourself
- **4.** See your own culture through a new lens: it's easy to accept your own culture as absolute, but experiencing a different culture can help inform your point of view on your home culture, allowing you to develop your own views rather than simply accepting those defined by where you happen to come from
- 5. Make lifelong friends: a shared international experience is a great way to bond with people and create life-long friendships with people from all around the world

MYTHS

- 1. Going abroad is just for "language studying" students: you can study and work abroad in English in countries across the world and all of our partner institutions offer courses taught in English but we do encourage you to learn some local lingo!
- 2. It will cost a fortune: many places are cheaper than the UK. There are scholarships available and if interested in going to a European country, the Erasmus+ programme currently offers a grant to help with living costs. Turing Scheme funding is also available for selected programmes. Please contact the International Opportunities Team if you would like further information. This funding is aimed at students who would not ordinarily have the opportunity to study or work overseas for personal or financial reasons.
- **3.** My chosen subject will be the same in every country: courses content and structure will vary greatly with location.
- 4. Teaching quality will be lower than at home: course contents will vary by institution as well as by country, and you're likely to find different strengths and weaknesses in each.
- 5. Travelling is a better way to see the world: travelling is a great way to see the world and an international opportunity is a great way to travel. You may find that by studying or working abroad you will have the best of both worlds: the ability to get to know a part of the world that you might not normally visit, and the opportunity to learn while you're there.

OUTCOMES

Compared to those who don't, students who go abroad are:

- **1.** 20% less likely to be out of work
- 2. 10% more likely to be in graduate jobs, six months after graduation
- **3.** 7% higher average wage earners, six months after graduation
- **4.** 19% more likely to gain a first in their degree
- **5.** A quarter of those who take part in the Erasmus+ scheme meet their long-term partner while studying abroad

Your Exchange Coordinator will be able to confirm if you are eligible to take part in either of these. You can find out who they are at salford.ac.uk/international-opportunities/things-to-know. Please note that you will need to meet the following criteria:

- Have a good academic standing with grades no lower than 50%, no re-sits, or have personal mitigating circumstances approved (specific requirements may vary across schools)
- / Be a good ambassador for our University

- Be clear about why you would like to study abroad, what you will gain from it, and how it fits into your future career plans

ERASMUS+ FOR STUDIES*

WHO?

Level 5 (second year of an undergraduate programme) students only. Options vary depending on your subject area. Please check with your Exchange Coordinator or Programme Leader.

HOW LONG FOR?

- / One trimester or a full academic year
- / Usually replacement trimester/year, i.e. the total duration of the course stays the same
- Also available as a sandwich year for some courses (between second and final year) if allowed by your school

WHERE?

Partner universities only, i.e. an Erasmus+ agreement between the two universities is required; please see our list of partner universities

COST

The Erasmus+ monthly grant ranges between €370 and €420 depending on your chosen destination. If you study abroad for a full year and you are a UK/home student, you may be eligible for an 85% reduction of your tuition fee to the University of Salford for that specific year. If you undertake a sandwich year, you won't have to pay tuition fees for that year. You won't have to pay any tuition fees to your host institution. The Erasmus+ grant is not available for virtual exchanges. For further information, please see Appendix A. Please note there is no financial support for virtual exchanges.

STUDIES

Modules to be undertaken during the exchange are chosen in conjunction with the Exchange Coordinator and the tutor at the host institution to make sure they match what you would have done at Salford. The grades you will receive at your host institution will not count towards your degree classification, but will show as a pass/fail.

ACCOMMODATION

Most of our partners are able to provide student accommodation but it is not guaranteed. Successful students will be given full support by their host institution to secure a place to live.

VISAS

You are responsible for obtaining your own visas and the International Opportunities Team are on hand to provide guidance and support. The International Opportunities Team are not qualified immigration specialists and immigration regulations are subject to change. You should refer to the national websites for general information in the first instance.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGES

WHO?

Level 5 (second year of an undergraduate programme) students only. Options vary depending on your subject area. Please check with your Exchange Coordinator or Programme Leader.



HOW LONG FOR?

- / One trimester or a full academic year
- Usually replacement trimester/year, i.e. the total duration of the course stays the same
- Also available as a sandwich year for some courses (between second and final year) if allowed by your school

WHERE?

Partner universities only, i.e. an International Exchange agreement between the two universities is required. *Please see Appendix B.*

COST

If you study abroad for a full year and you are a UK/home student, you may be eligible for an 85% reduction of your tuition fee to the University of Salford for that specific year. You won't have to pay any tuition fees to your host institution. For further information. *Please see Appendix A.*

STUDIES

Modules to be undertaken abroad are chosen in conjunction with the Exchange Coordinator and the Tutor at the receiving institution to make sure they match what you would have done at Salford. The grades you will receive at your host institution will not count towards your degree classification; they will show as a pass/fail.

ACCOMMODATION

Most of our partners are able to provide student accommodation but it is not guaranteed. Successful students will be given full support by their host institution to secure a place to live.

VISAS

You are responsible for obtaining your own visas and the International Opportunities Team are on hand to provide guidance and support. TURING SCHEME

The University of Salford has been awarded funding through the UK Government's Turing Scheme to support international study or work opportunities in the 2021-22 academic year. At the time of writing, we do not yet know arrangements for 2022 and beyond.


Funding will cover International Exchange study placements at partners in USA, Canada and South Korea as well as school specific mobilities in a range of countries worldwide.

Turing Scheme funding is primarily aimed at students who would not ordinarily have the opportunity to study or work overseas due to financial reasons and/or those from widening participation backgrounds.

THE AIM OF THE UNIVERSITY OF SALFORD (UOS) INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES—TURING PROJECT IS TO:

- Increase the number of UoS students participating in an international study or work activity as part of their degree by 250 by 2022, thereby contributing to a positive impact in skills development, social mobility and future employability outcomes. Around 30 International Exhange study placements are included in the overall funding.
- Provide high quality placement provision, excellence in supporting students, and effective promotion of the short and long-term benefits of participation.





INTERNATIONAL **WORK EXPERIENCES ERASMUS+ FOR TRAINING***

WHO?

All students. Options vary depending on your subject area. Please check with your Exchange Coordinator or Programme Leader.

WHAT?

- / Placements, internships, traineeships and jobs. Must be relevant to your study path. Also virtual
- Often summer work placements (voluntary); sometimes part of the student's academic programme (i.e. credit bearing)
- / Also available as a sandwich year for some courses (between second and final year)
- / May also be available as graduate traineeships

HOW LONG FOR?

Minimum duration of two months, maximum duration of twelve months.

WHERE?

Any university, organisation or company operating in one of the eligible countries, (see erasmusplus.org.uk/participating-countries) i.e. an Erasmus+ agreement between the University of Salford and the host institution is not required.

COST

The Erasmus+ monthly grant ranges between €470 and €520 depending on your chosen destination. Some employers will also offer a salary and/or a reimbursement of some expenses. If you take a sandwich year, you won't have to pay tuition fees for that specific year. The Erasmus+ grant is not available for virtual placements. For further information, please see Appendix A.



Thompson Rivers University

TRU's Kamloops and Williams Lake campuses are located on the traditional territory of the Secwepemc peoples, in British Columbia's southern interior. In Kamloops (from the Secwepemc word for "meeting of the waters"), the main campus overlooks the junction of the North Thompson and South Thompson rivers, from which the university gets its name. Today, 14,000 students study on campus in Kamloops, Williams Lake, or at the regional centres in 100 Mile House, Clearwater, Barriere, Ashcroft, and Lillooet. 


