What is Green Impact?

Green Impact is a sustainability accreditation scheme with a competitive stream, run internationally by SOS-UK (formerly a part of the NUS). It's a simple, fun and flexible way for departments and teams to improve their environmental performance and promote sustainability at the University.

How does Green Impact work?

Staff form teams across the University and work through an online toolkit of actions together. A team can be any size and cover an office, department, building, or even a whole School or

Division.

For most teams, the office toolkit will be the most relevant. It contains actions within different sustainability themes:

- Energy & Water
- Waste & Recycling
- Travel
- Communications
- Procurement
- Health & Wellbeing
- · Charity & Volunteering

Each action is allocated either 5, 10 or 15 points, and the team decides which actions to complete. The total number of points a team achieves will determine whether they receive a "working towards Bronze" accreditation, or an award: Bronze, Silver, Gold or Platinum.

We also have specialist toolkits for teams who are based in labs and catering outlets. Tese toolkits provide more appropriate sustainability actions for these departments. If you decide to complete more than one toolkit, you will need to set-up a separate profile for each toolkit. Contact Marta for more information on how to manage this.

We have a "Getting Started" section which contains actions to help improve your Green Impact experience and get started with the programme. If you are new to Green Impact, this is a good place to start, but established teams can also complete these actions and will find them just as useful.

As well as completing actions, teams have the option to implement their own projects, and they can receive up to 50 points for each project. To do this, teams will need to read the Briefing Document, submit a Project Plan for approval, undertake their project, and complete a Project Case Study.

Once they have submitted their toolkits, teams are audited by trained students to ensure their submissions are accurate and to provide them with extra support. All participating teams will be invited to an award ceremony, where we will also present five Special Awards.





HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED?

- 1. Start up a Green Impact team in your department, floor or building, or join an existing one.
- 2. All team members need to register by visiting www.greenimpact.org.uk/salford. The registration code is 97.
- 3. Meet with your team, review the toolkit and make an action plan.
- 4. Complete the "Getting Started" actions.
- 5. Start completing actions in your relevant toolkit, and/or projects if you wish.
- 6. Keep in touch!
