General overview

Deadlines and timelines

Spring 2022. Nomination by October 1, 2021. Application materials to MTSU by October 31, 2021 including initial immunization information. Acceptance letter and DS-2019 for visa in early November 2021 provided all application documents have been received. Registration for classes in November and December 2021. Semester begins mid-January 2022.

Fall 2022. Nomination by March 1, 2022. Application materials to MTSU by April 15, 2022 including initial immunization information. Acceptance letter and DS-2019 for visa in early May 2022 provided all application documents have been received. Registration for classes in June and July 2022. Semester begins late August 2022.

Academic entry requirements

Prefer 2.5 GPA

Visa entry requirements

Proof of immunization for MTSU requirements and completion of all application materials, proof of minimum funds for semester abroad. Completion of Form DS-160 (online visa application), 5 x5 cm photo taken in the last 6 months, application fee and receipt of payment, current passport must be valid for at least six months beyond your proposed stay in the U.S., interview at the U.S. Embassy or Consulate, form DS-2019 (provided by MTSU). <u>https://uk.usembassy.gov/visas/study-exchange/</u>

Language requirements

English language requirements: TOEFL 500 (paper), 173 (computer), 61 (internet); IELTS 5.5; ELS 110; Duolingo English Test 85 undergraduate. Students who speak English as a first language are not required to provide evidence of language requirement.

Cost of living

Estimated costs are:

- 1. Housing \$2,600 \$4,000 per semester
- 2. Meals \$1,500 \$2,100 per semester (there are meal options on campus)
- 3. Books & class supplies \$500 \$1,000 per semester
- 4. Health Insurance (required) \$350 \$700 per semester
- 5. Personal Expenses \$1,000 \$2,000 per semester (depends on student spending habits)

Cultural information

The southern U.S. may be very different! There may be a strong southern accent, many people attend church and religious life is important in the daily lives of many residents, people are very friendly and will chat with you, including asking questions that may feel intrusive if you are not used to it (How are you? Where are you from? Are you religious? etc...). We also have a large immigrant community so there is a nice inter-cultural component to the area. Nashville proper is home to the heart of country music and music is everywhere. Public transportation is not great, most people drive or use Uber or Lyft to get around. It is very hot and humid in the summer. It is also very green and there are many places to walk trails, get outside, etc... There are many restaurants; refills on water, soda, iced tea is free, portions are large, and you can take home your leftovers for later. Tipping in restaurants is the norm.

Travel information

Students will fly into Nashville International Airport (BNA). The easiest way to get to campus is via Uber, Lyft, or airport shuttle. There are a few campus shuttles on arrival day as well.
