Thompson Rivers University

General overview

A city of about 85,000, Kamloops is conveniently located at the junction of three major highways and an airport, and is just hours away from major hubs in BC, Alberta and the United States (and maybe even the place you call home). Kamloops has the third lowest annual rainfall in all of Canada and over 2,000 hours of sunshine annually. The Kamloops region is enriched by the culture and traditions of more than 15 First Nations including the Secwepemc, on whose territory TRU is established. Set on 250 acres with stunning views of the North and South Thompson Rivers, TRU's main campus in the heart of our community offers plenty of opportunities to live, work, play and learn. TRU is a tapestry of cultures.

We welcome over 3,000 students from more than 90 countries to campus each year. The average class size for lower-level courses is 33. In upper-level courses, it's 29. There's a hundred student clubs to choose from — one for almost every interest. Thompson Rivers University has been granted accreditation by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU). TRU is currently the highest-rated university in the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education's global Sustainability Tracking, Assessment and Rating System (STARS).

Deadlines and timelines

Fall entry: nomination by March 25th - application by April 8th

Winter enter: nomination by August 19th - application by September 3rd

Letter of admission usually issued by email within 4 weeks of receipt of application; supporting documents issued after acceptance from our International Student Advising team.

Language requirements

Applicants are required to meet minimum English language proficiency requirements for direct entry into academic programs. Academic requirements - Admission requirements vary, but all TRU programs require secondary school completion for academic admission. Link to TRU English Language Requirements: <https://www.tru.ca/English-requirements.html> Students may meet this condition by either providing an acceptable English language proficiency test score (TOEFL, IELTS, etc.) or by achieving an acceptable score on the TRU English Placement Test (EPT). If students do not provide a test score in advance, they will be tested on arrival and their course placement decisions will be made at that time. Recommended to complete acceptable tests prior to arrival to improve course selection options, however this is not mandatory.

We offer English-as-a Second Language, English literature, Communications, and language courses in French, Spanish, Japanese and German.
